Volunteers are now able to sign-up with ResearchMatch and view the website in simplified Chinese in addition to English and Spanish.


Both new and existing volunteers may now specify Chinese (or English or Spanish) as a preferred language, as well as indicate their nation of origin within their volunteer profile. To make these updates to your profile, please follow the instructions below:

- 1. Login to ResearchMatch.org
- 2. Click the Update your health information link
- 3. Use the left-hand menu to open the **Account Preferences** page and answer the new question to specify your preferred language.





4. Use the left-hand menu to open the **Race & Ethnicity** page, to select your nation of origin within each category.
